So children, first we will learn about the use of 'is', 'are' and 'am'.

Look at the pictures below and read the sentences -

children, the underlined words (am, is, are) in the sentences number 1, 2, 3 are form of verbs. They are called helping verbs.

We use am, is, are with pronouns or nouns in present tense.

Let us see when do we use 'am' -

'Am' is the most easy helping verb.

We always use 'am' with 'I'. For example -

1. I am a boy.
2. I am a girl.
3. I am going out to play.

Let us see when do we use 'is' -

We always use 'is' with singular noun and pronoun, for example - he, she, it, this, that  
(Singular noun means one person, one thing, one animal and one place)

For example -

1. He is my father.
2. She is playing.
3. This is my book.
4. Peacock is a beautiful bird. It is our national bird.
5. Chandigarh is a beautiful city.
6. That is my house.

Now let us see the use of 'are' -

We always use 'are' with plural noun. Plural means more than one. We also use 'are' with pronouns - you, they, we, these, those.

Dear parents, help your child to do an activity to make your child understand the use of 'is / are'. Keep few pencils, colours and books. Encourage your child to make sentences using 'is' or 'are'.

We use was / were with the past tense form of verb.



We use was with I, he, she, it, that, this, singular noun. (singular noun means one thing, one person, one animal).

For example -

He was in Class I last year.

She was crying.

Children, we are using 'was' with he, she as they are referring to one in above sentences.

Now let us see the use of 'were' -


We always use 'were' with plural noun. Plural noun means more than one person, more than one thing and more than one animal.





Two puppies

We use were with we, you, they, these / those, plural noun.
