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Story Sums Money

1. I bought an icecream for ₹8.50 and chocolates for ₹20.00. How much money did I spend?

Money spent on an ice cream = ₹8.50

Money spent on chocolate = ₹20.00

Total money spent = ₹8.50 + ₹20.00

$$\begin{array}{r} \text{₹} \quad \text{p} \\ 8.50 \\ + 20.00 \\ \hline 28.50 \end{array}$$

2. Atul bought a notebook for ₹28.00. He gave ₹100 to the shopkeeper. How much money will he get back?

Money given to the shopkeeper = ₹100

Cost of a notebook = ₹28.00

Money he will get back = ₹100 - ₹28.00

$$\begin{array}{r} \text{₹} \quad \text{p} \\ 100.00 \\ - 28.00 \\ \hline 72.00 \end{array}$$

Ans ₹72.00

3. I gave ₹ 200 to the shopkeeper. I bought football for ₹ 120. How much money will I get back?

Money given to the shopkeeper = ₹ 200
 Cost of football = ₹ 120
 Money I will get back = ₹ 200 - ₹ 120

-	120	00
	<u>080</u>	<u>00</u>

Ans - ₹ 80.00

4. Seema had ₹ 175 in her piggy bank. Out of which, she spent ₹ 25. How much money is left with her?

Money in the Piggy bank = ₹ 175
 She spent = ₹ 25
 Money is left with her = ₹ 175 - ₹ 25

	<u>150</u>	<u>00</u>

Ans ₹ 150

5. My grandfather gave me ₹150 on my birthday. I spent ₹89. How much money is left?

Money given by grandfather = ₹150
Money spent = ₹89
Money left = ₹150 - ₹89
