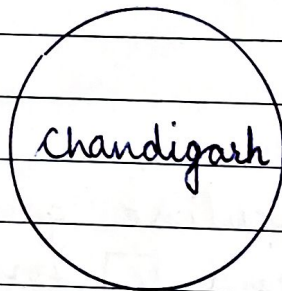
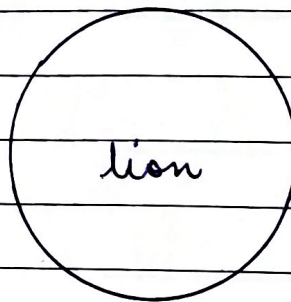
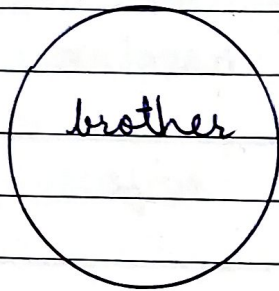

Rule - 6

Nouns that end with 'f' or 'fe' form their plural by changing 'f' or 'fe' into -ves.

For example.

	Singular	Plural
1.	knife	knives
2.	loaf	loaves
3.	half	halves
4.	leaf	leaves
5.	calf	calves
6.	life	lives
7.	shelf	shelves
8.	wife	wives
9.	wolf	wolves
10.	elf	elves

Rule - 7

There are nouns that do not change in their plural form. For example -

	Singular	Plural
1.	deer	deer
2.	sheep	sheep
