Students this lesson is for Class IV for the subject of English Language in which Chapter 10, Adjectives of Quantity and Number is covered starting on page number 44 of your textbook titled 'My Grammar Time'.

Read the sentences and note the words in red

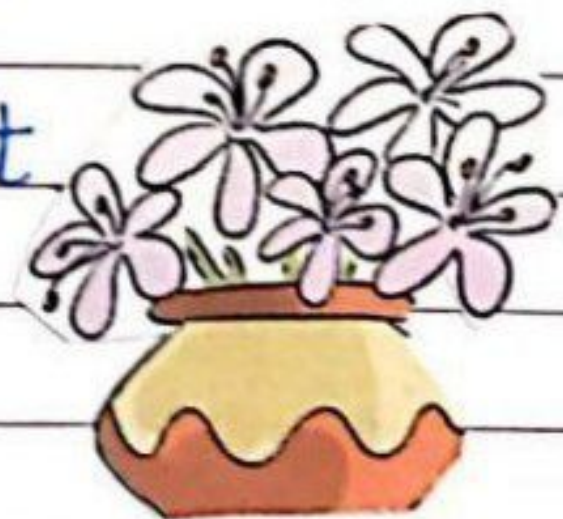
1. There is enough milk in the glass



2. I have four cats.



3. There are five flowers in the pot



4. There is a little oil.



The adjectives **enough** and **little** describe the quantity of the nouns **milk** and **oil**.

★ Adjectives of quantity tell us **how much** of something there is. They are used with **uncountable nouns**.

★ **Some, no, any, whole, all, much** and **many** are some other common adjectives of quantity.

In above sentences, the adjectives **four** and **five** describe the number of the nouns **cats** and **flowers**.

★ Adjectives of number tell us **how many** persons, animals or things are. They also tell us about the position of a noun in a series. They are used with **countable nouns**.

★ Adjectives of number include :

- a. cardinal numbers (**one, two, three**)
- b. ordinal numbers (**first, second, third**)
- c. words like **all, several, many** and **few**.

ALWAYS REMEMBER!

The same adjective may be used as an adjective of quantity or an adjective of number.

For example:

★ I saw **some** children playing on the field.
(The word **some** describes the countable noun **children**. It answers the question **how many?** It is an adjective of number.)

★ I poured **some** milk into the jug.
(The word **some** describes the uncountable noun **milk**. It answers the question **how much?** So, It is an adjective of quantity.)

★ Similarly, **any** can be used with both **countable** and **uncountable** nouns.

★ **Some** is used in positive sentences and **any** is used in questions and negative sentences.
