Chapter 10 India - Physical Divisions (Continued)

Good Morning Students!

In the previous lecture we studied about three physical divisions in India. Let us continue here and study about the other three.

The Peninsular Plateau:- It is roughly triangular in shape. It lies to the south of the Northern Plains. The large part of the plateau lying to the south of the Narmada River is called the Deccan Plateau. The other two parts of Peninsular Plateau are the Malwa Plateau which lies towards the west and Chota Nagpur Plateau is in the north east of the Peninsular Plateau. The Deccan Plateau is bounded by the Satpura-Mahadeva and Maikala ranges in the North, the Western Ghats in the west and the Eastern Ghats in the east. The most important rivers are the Mahanadi, Godavari, Krishna, Kaveri.

The Deccan Plateau is rich in black soil and minerals such as iron, coal and mica. Cotton and oilseeds are the major crops in this region.

The Coastal Region :- The West coastal region lies between the Arabian Sea and the Western Ghats. The East coastal plains lies between the Bay of Bengal and the Eastern Ghats. We generally

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find hot and humid climate here.

The Islands:- Two groups of islands are there in Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal. These are Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the Lakshadweep Islands.
