Children, read aloud the sentences given below:

Rajiv has a sister, Rita. Rajiv and Rita go to the same school. Rajiv is a good actor. Rajiv has acted in many plays. Rita is not only a good dancer, Rita can also sing. Rajiv and Rita have a pet dog. Rajiv and Rita call the dog King.

You must have noticed that the use of the nouns - Rajiv, Rita and dog - over and over again has made the sentences clumsy.



Now read these sentences which are really the same sentences rewritten:

Rajiv has a sister, Rita. They go to the same school. Rajiv is a good actor. He has acted in many plays. Rita is not only a good dancer, she can also sing. They have a pet dog. They call it King.

The sentences have become simpler and more readable, because the nouns- Rajiv, Rita and dog - have been replaced with they, he, she and it.

A word such as he, she, they, it, which can be used instead of a noun, is called a pronoun.

Here are some more pronouns:

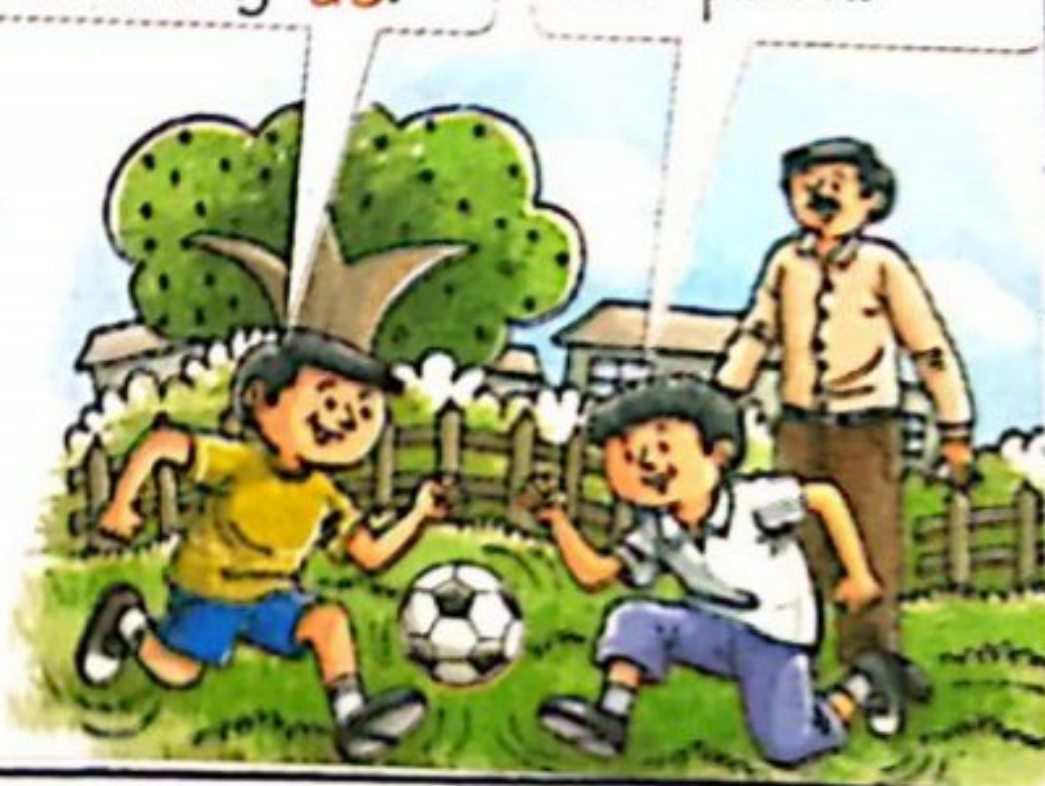
