Chapter 9 States of India

India is in Asia and is the seventh largest country in the world. India shares its land boundaries with Pakistan, Afghanistan, China, Nepal, Bhutan, Myanmar and Bangladesh.

Today India has 28 states and eight Union Territories including the National Capital Territory of Delhi. New Delhi is the capital of India.

Every state has a capital called the state capital. The Union Territories are governed by the Central Government. This division of India into smaller parts is done for the purpose of administration.

Rajasthan is the largest state in area. Telengana is the newest state. Summer, winter and monsoons are generally seen in India. Students, you can refer to map given on Page No. 56 to know about the location of the states of India.
