

- (iii) The legislature controls over the functioning of the executive branch.

Ans: The Supreme Court of India is the highest court in the country and is important because it protects the fundamental rights of citizens, interprets the constitution and resolves legal disputes.

⑥ In how many list the subject of law divided? Explain the Union list.

Ans: The subject of law has divided into three list and they are: - ① Union list ② State list
③ Concurrent list

→ Union list: This list contains subjects that are of national importance such as defence, foreign affairs and currency. The central government makes laws on the subjects in this list.
