3. Manipur is culturally rich and known for its classical dance 'Manipuri' and Loktak Lake, which is home to the unique floating phumdis.

Capital : Imphal



4. Meghalaya is called the 'Abode of Clouds' and known for living root bridges. It receives the highest rainfall through out the year in the country.

Capital : Shillong

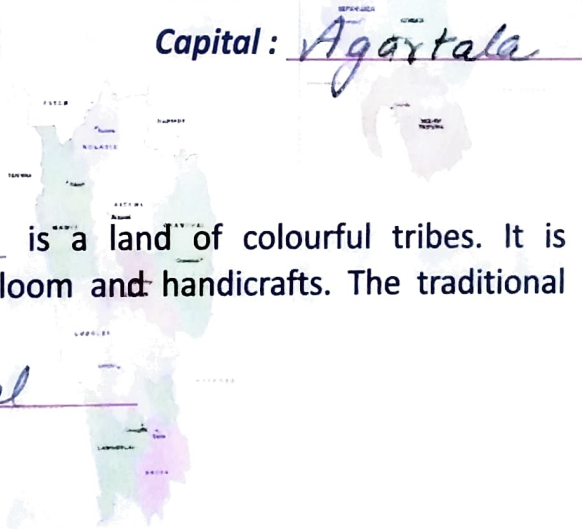
5. Nagaland is famous for its tribal culture and the Hornbill festival. The traditional musical instrument is the bamboo mouth organ.
