Assertive Sentences - An assertive (or declarative) e.g. Tansen was one of the nine gens in the coust of Akbar. * An Assertive sentence can be either affirmative or negative. Kinds Of Sentences * * Assertive to Interrogative: If the assertive sentence is positive, the Corresponding interrogative sentence is negative in form.
