A preposition is a word which shows the relation between a noun or a pronoun and some other word in a sentence The word preposition means placing before So a preposition is placed before a noun or a pronoun. The other word can be a noun, a verb or an adjective. too example 1. Who painted on the wall? 2. The father was angry with Arun. In Sentence 1, on Shows the relation between the wall (noun) and the painting (noun). In Sentence 2, with shows the relation between Arun (noun) and angry (adjective).

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Children! Different prepositions show different relations. For example

* under the tree, behind the tree, over the tree, near the tree

Prepositions of time, place and movement

1 Prepositions of time: Prepositions of time indicate
a specific period of time, such as month,
date, time and day.

For example.

(i) The exam will start on Monday.

(ii) He reached the station at 7 o' clock in the evening.

There are some other prepositions of time.

at, on, in, for, till/until, before, after, during,
by Tuesday, during winters.
