Let us understand the chapter "Sushutra – The First Indian Plastic Surgeon" (Chapter 6) in your English Reader.

As the father shares this story, time passes quickly. Eventually, the doors of the operating theatre open, and the mother is wheeled out with her face bandaged. The doctor informs them that the surgery was successful, and the mother would soon have a beautifully reconstructed nose. Overjoyed and relieved, the family praises and thanks God and the surgeon, and they follow the mother to her room.
