The first Indian to have ever won an individual Olympic gold, his career at one stage was jeopardised by a nagging back injury. Despite this, he emerged as the winner of an individual gold in the 10 m Air Rifle event in the 2008 Olympics. Abhinav Rindro 5. A former Major league Baseball pitcher he played the game despite being born without a right hand. He was honored as the United States flag bearer at the Pan Jim Abbott American Games.
