## India: Geographical Features

### (1) Introduction

- India is officially known as Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic Republic of India.
- It is the world's seventh largest country.
- It has different physiographic divisions.
- It is rich in many natural resources.
- India also has difference in climate.

### (2) Location and Extent

- Latitudinal extent of India is  $6^{\circ}45'N$  to  $37^{\circ}6'N$  from Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Moreover, the latitudinal extent of Indian Mainland is  $8^{\circ}4'N$  to  $37^{\circ}6'N$ .
- Longitudinal extent of India is  $68^{\circ}7'E$  to  $97^{\circ}25'E$ .
- The southernmost point of India is Indira Point and the northernmost point is Indira Col.
- The north-south extent of India is 3214 kms, while the East-west extent is 2933 kms.
- The north-south extent is from Kashmir to Kanyakumari and the East-west extent is from Rann of Kutch to Arunachal Pradesh.
- The southernmost point of Indian Mainland is Cape Comorin in Kanyakumari.
- The length of Indian coastline is 7516.6 kms.
- The standard Meridian of India is  $82^{\circ}30'E$  and it passes through Allahabad. This meridian gives Indian Standard Time.
- The Indian Standard Time is  $5\frac{1}{2}$  hrs ahead of Greenwich.
- The Tropic of Cancer passes through centre of India and divides it into North temperate and South tropical region.
- The Tropic of Cancer passes through Rajasthan, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Chattisgarh, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Tripura and Mizoram.

### (3) Boundaries and Neighbouring Countries

- Indian Peninsula is bounded by Arabian Sea in West, Bay of Bengal in East and Indian Ocean in South.
- In north, India is separated from rest of Asia by Himalayas.
- Our neighbours to the north are China, Nepal, Bhutan.
- To the East lies Myanmar.
- To the South of Siliguri Corridor of India lies Bangladesh.
- To the west lies Pakistan.
- To the south lies Sri Lanka and Maldives.
