#### (7) Conservation of forests in India

- Under this Govt. of India introduced a programme to protect, conserve and develop the forest area. This is called programme of Forest conservation.

Now,

The measures taken under this programme are:

- Preventive act on destruction of forests
- Prevention of wildlife was done by promoting Biosphere Reserve forests.
- Several forest region is declared as reserved forests to protect both trees and species.
- planting more tree for development of Environmental forestry.
- Forest Development Corporation has been setup to take care of forests product and developing new forest resources.

#### (8) India-wildlife

(a) - India is rich in fauna.

- It has more than 89000 animals species and 1200 Birds species.
- It has 13% of world's total.
- India has 2500 species of fishes. It accounts for 12% of world's total.
- India has 5 to 8% of world's reptiles and mammals.

(b) - Elephants in India are found in forest of Assam, Karnataka and Kerala.

- one horned rhino is also found in forests of Assam and West Bengal.
- wild ass and camels are found in part of Kutchh and Thar Desert.

- (c) - India has both lions and tigers.  
- In India, Asiatic Lion is found in Gir forest in Gujarat.  
- Tigers are found in Madhya Pradesh, Sunderbans and Himalayan Region.  
- Leopards are also found in India.
- (d) - Freezing high altitudes of Himalayas are home of Yak, shaggy horned wild ox, Tibetan Antelope, snow leopard and red panda.
- (e) turtles, crocodiles and Gharials are found in rivers, lakes and coastal areas.
- (f) India has many birds like Peacock, peacocks, ducks, Parakeets, cranes and pigeons. India also has many migratory birds.
- (g) Conservation of wildlife  
steps taken by govt. to conserve wildlife are:  
→ Legal protection act was provided to safeguard wild animals against hunting and commercial exploitation, under Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.  
→ Financial and technical assistance is provided to the state govt. to integrate the development of wildlife habitat.  
→ Govt. has also set up around 103 National parks, many wildlife sanctuaries, 535 Bird Sanctuaries and 18 Biosphere reserves to protect wildlife.
