Soil Pollution

Soil pollution refers to presence of unwanted substance in soil. These unwanted substance pollute the soil and makes it unfit for humans, plants, animals, microorganisms etc.

Sources of Soil pollution

- The use of pesticides, fungicides, fertilizers etc contaminates soil a lot.
- Industrial waste from pulp and paper mills, oil refineries etc pollutes the soil a lot.
- The sewage, garbage and waste dumping in open lands also contaminates soil.
- The occurrence of acid rain degrades the soil fertility and also contaminates it.
- The Hospital waste when mixes with soil contaminates it with Pathogens that affects human health.

Radiation Pollution

- It is the emission of highly charged particles and electromagnetic rays entering the Earth's Atmosphere from outer space.
- These days manmade activities are also leading to this kind of pollution.

Sources of Radiation pollution

- The cosmic rays emit radioactive radiation that are very harmful for living organisms and life supporting natural resources like Air water and soil.

- waste generated during nuclear weapon testing.
- mining and processing of Uranium.
- X-Ray waste and nuclear Arsenal explosion.
