### Summary of the Poem :

The poem, 'A Doctor's Journal Entry For August 6, 1945', is narrated by a doctor, as told in the title of the poem itself. He narrates everything from his perspective. In the course of the poem, he is speaking with his wife, giving her some hope and assurance, and sometimes instructing her. But the doctor's wife does not say anything in the entire poem. So the poem may be called a dramatic monologue.

The poem is written in free verse pattern, with no rhyme and no particular meter followed. Even the poem is not divided into stanzas. It is a continuous narration of the happenings, of what the narrator came across and what he thought or felt. It is in the form of journal entry for the particular date.

Irony, images, symbolism are used in the poem.

### Explanation IN Detail

The poem begins on a fine morning with a calm and serene note. The doctor says that it was dawn (morning) and he was half-clothed as he had just got up from bed and was stretching his arms and legs to remove the sleepy feeling. He was gazing outside at the gleam and the shadow of the leaves. Suddenly he saw two strong flashes of light, and the stone lantern in his room lit up by itself. The doctor wondered whether the flashes were magnesium flares seen during a war.

In the next moment, the doctor discovered that the roof and the walls of his house were collapsed and the debris were scattered all over. Dust occupied the whole place. The doctor strangely found out that his half-pants and undershirt disappeared from his body. They were all burnt in the flashes.

The doctor then tells us how he was wounded on his cheek and thigh and that he was bleeding in the right side. He removed a piece of glass that had entered into his body. He was trying to figure out the reason of the disturbance/destruction all around. Then the doctor came to his senses and got worried about the whereabouts of his wife Yeko-San. He was dumbstruck on looking at her as she looked pale, frightened and had blood stains on her body and she came out holding her elbow.

The doctor gave encouragement to his wife that they would be fine. He seemed an optimistic, caring and comforting man while motivating Yeko-San. His indomitable spirit gives encouragement to the reader even in the face of difficulty. While getting out of the house, they stumbled over something on their way. Then he realised that it was the head of a man who was crushed to death under a gate and begged for mercy. The doctor's apology for stumbling over the head of a man indicates his generous nature.

'A Doctor's Journal Entry for August 6, 1945' describes in detail the devastation caused by war. Then the couple saw a house before them that 'tilted, swayed, toppled and crashed'. Fire erupted in the dust and was spreading fast by the wind. They then realised that they should go to the hospital and get the desired aid. The doctor also wanted to help his staff but then he realised that how could he help his staff when he himself was injured.

His legs could not take it any more and he sat down on the ground. He felt very thirsty but he could not find any water to drink. He was panting but he gained some strength bit by bit and finally he got up and walked towards the hospital. The doctor also emphasises the horrific side of loss when he highlights the fact that he wasn't ashamed of his naked state then, this horrible thought had disturbed him a bit only. Then a soldier gave him a towel. But the Doctor's legs were so badly injured that he could not walk any more and requested his wife to go ahead alone. Yoko-san was reluctant to move alone but they had no choice in such a distressed condition.

The doctor could hear neither a word, nor a cry of pain. They are all shocked to silence.
